URGENT PLEED – NEED HELP!

There are 5 students who got direct entry (ie. partial scholarships) to 4 year universities. Maryline Wekesa is studying radiology. She is fully sponsored. The other 4 students need sponsorship. Jared Wanyonyi, David Wakwabubi, and Mercyline Wafula are planning to study secondary education, and Sharon Ngutuku is planning to study special education. These are our top 5 students, it would be a shame for any of them not to go on to college with a partial scholarship.

Each student needs an **additional \$1500** per term. There are 3 terms per year and these students are all in 4 year programs (they have to be in a 4 year program to receive their scholarships each term). College is so expensive in Kenya that there is no way for these young adults to work and save up enough money to attend college on their own. The average pay in Kenya is less than \$2 per day.
