Most of them are reckless and I'm certain this would make a huge difference should I be able to achieve my dreams. In primary school I liked all subjects but my favorite were Mathematics and Kiswahili because I enjoyed reading and doing calculations. Science was quite difficult for me therefore was my least favorite.

I'm physically healthy and strong. I like playing netball, singing and always participated in dramas in primary school. Cooking is also one of my hobbies. I come from a Christian background which I ascribe to myself. This belief has helped me and my family live in peace. My parents are my role models because they are kind and good at working and are also caring.

I heard about Living Hope High School from my village friends who had positive attributions about it. I and my father were encouraged to seek an opportunity during interviews and see
