Samuel Wakoli's story

My birthday is Aug 15 which makes me 18 years old. I like doing agriculture and taking care of trees and I want to be a forester. I came to Living Hope while I was in P5. I was living near LHHS and I got to know them and they got to know me. They found out that I was smart but starving and I needed help.

I was studying at Chekulo Primary where I used to walk to school. I was being sent home at least once a week for school fees. My parents were so poor that they could not afford to pay for me or buy food. Mum Marilyn sent me to Sunset, a private primary school. Because of poor sanitation, I was sick regularly and had life threatening nosebleeds. At that point I needed a sponsor to help pay my school fees. I met Larry Anderson and he sponsored me for the next few years until I went to high school. Evans, the driver,

told Mum Marilyn about a school run by the government called Nzoia Industrial Primary School which had a good environment. I started there at the bottom of the class. With each semester, I improved on both my academics and health. When it was time to graduate from primary, I was number two in my class and number one in Math. I was a leader and became head boy. I took my KCPE TEST and scored well enough to join Living Hope High School. We had a mission team which had come to build a bridge. That was when I met Pastor Jenny Williams, who is now my current sponsor. She was impressed with my hard work and how I worked hard to help everyone. After she saw the good work I was doing, she decided to sponsor me.

After Joining LHHS, I became the school hunter. The rest of the students were afraid to go up in the attic. It was dark and creepy up there. There were snakes, ants and wasps and lots of rats and mice. I must have been a warrior in my past life because I am not afraid and I never got stung or bitten. Now, I let the rest of the kids kill the mice and rats on the ground and I hunt in the attics two to three times a week. Mum gives us 50 cents for a dead mouse and a dollar for a dead rat and a dollar for a dead snake. The rest I do for free as a service to the school to help them out.

I am planning to go to Berea College in Kentucky after graduation. They specialize in forestry. (I wish I could go right now but I am only in Form 3 and I need to finish high school first). Besides hunting, I am excellent in Math and I have won several rewards.

Mudding and Fence Building



December is always a busy month, It is when the maintenance of all the buildings in the compound takes place. Mudding all the dorms and other houses was finished last week. They are looking good. Last December, we re-mudded the interior of all the dorms, so this year, we had to work on the exterior.

For the last two months, we have been rebuilding the fences. The fence posts usually last about a year because of termites, so it's a continuous process of getting the fences in order. We finished the soccer field and it is looking awesome. Praise the Lord for all of the students and others who help with the upkeep of the school.
